How Can He Ask For Everything?

When we hear the story of the apostles in today's Gospel from Luke 5, it places a challenge in front of us that we are also called to give more of our lives to Jesus Christ. They were going about their daily work when Jesus approaches them: "He saw two boats there alongside the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets." Some may say He interrupted them. Since He is the giver and sustainer of our lives He has the authority to interrupt our lives. We don't always like it or expect it when our lives get interrupted, but learning to expect the interruptions and seemingly inconveniences is part of growing in faith. What we think is a priority or a pressing project that needs completed does not always match up with what is most important in God's view. We are blessed each day with many gifts and graces from God. What we receive from God is not meant to be controlled. Since His gifts and graces are a blessing to us they are meant to be shared with others as a blessing. St. Paul says in our second reading from 1 Corinthians, "For I handed on to you as of first importance what I also received". It is fair to say we would not be praying in the church and worshiping at Mass had the apostles and St. Paul not handed on the blessings and the faith that they had received. The Gospel story continues, "Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon said in reply, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that the boats were in danger of sinking. When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him, and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him." Let us join the apostles in astonishment at God's generosity to us. In gratitude for His generosity, let us ask for the grace to give everything to the Lord. Let us pray together:

Receive, Lord, my entire freedom. Accept the whole of my memory, my intellect and my will.
Whatever I have or possess, it was you who gave it to me; I restore it to you in full,
and I surrender it completely to the guidance of your will. Give me only love of you
together with your grace, and I am rich enough and ask for nothing more.
Amen.
