Did You Hear That?

As we hear Jesus say in today's Gospel, "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me," it is a good reminder of our need to listen daily to the voice of our Good Shepherd Jesus Christ. Here are 4 steps that I find helpful to hear and respond to the voice of God in our daily lives.

Acknowledge – thoughts, feelings and desires. Anger, frustration, anxiety, etc. that you are feeling; acknowledge it is real.

Relate – Tell the Lord all about your thoughts, feelings and desires. This step of relating gets it off your chest and places it in the hands of the Lord.

Receive - Ask Him for His grace, His guidance as to what to do with the thoughts, feelings and desires you are having, what direction to go to find freedom, how to let go. Pray the grace: "Jesus, I give You permission to love me."

Respond – Only once you have **received** the grace or the direction the Lord wants you to go can you respond and take the necessary steps forward to freedom.

World Day of Prayer is observed today, Sunday, May 12, 2019, also known as "Good Shepherd Sunday." The purpose of this day is to publically fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). Please pray that young men and women hear and respond generously to the Lord's call to the priesthood, diaconate, religious life, societies of apostolic life or secular institutes.

Prayer for Vocations: God our Father, we thank you for calling men and women to serve in your Son's Kingdom as priests, deacons, religious, and consecrated persons. Send your Holy Spirit to help us respond generously and courageously to your call. May our community of faith support vocations of sacrificial love in our youth. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen

Let us ask our Mother Mary to intercede for all mothers: Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thy intercession was left unaided.
